

Setting up Proxy

If you want to surf the web with a proxy on Android and can't/don't want to root your device then **Opera Mobile** is the solution.

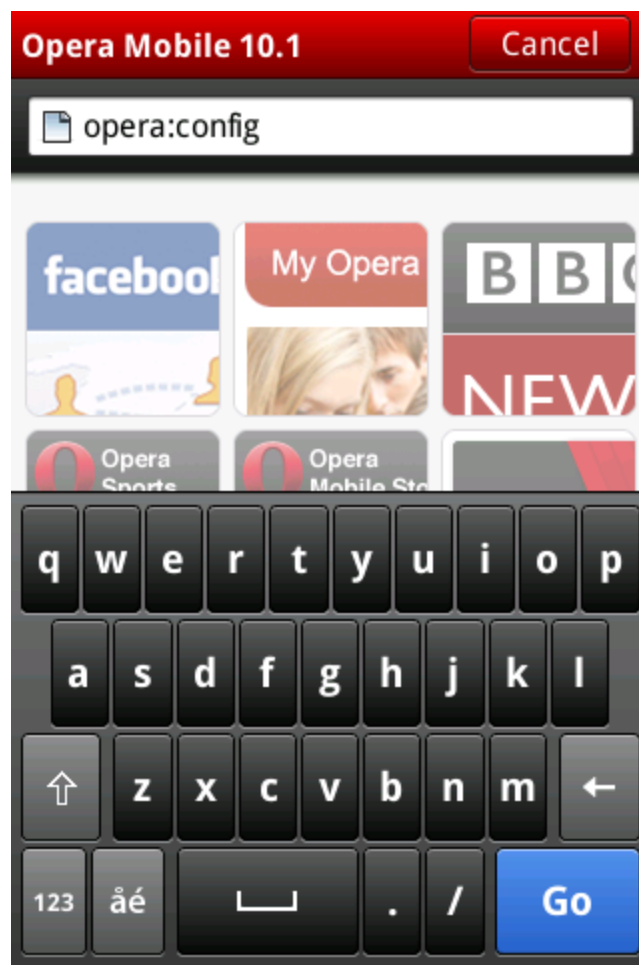
If Opera Mobile is not installed on your phone then go get a copy from the Android Market:

If you don't have Internet access on your phone, then download a copy from Opera's website then transfer and install it to your phone:

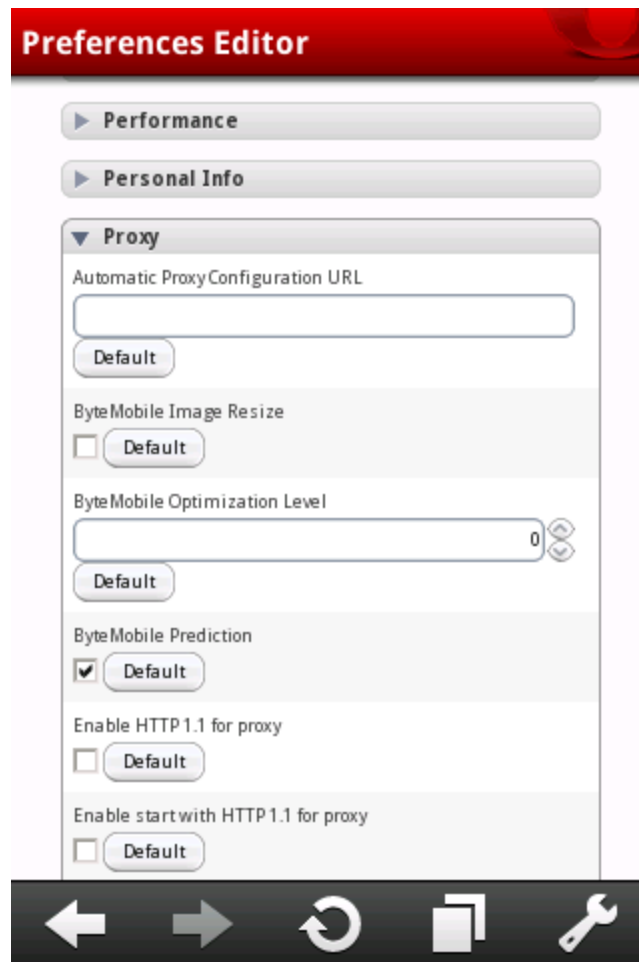

Once you have connected to the Wi-Fi network with the proxy and have Opera Mobile running:

1. Type **opera:config** into the address bar then enter



2. Scroll down the page until you get to **Proxy** and click it to display the settings



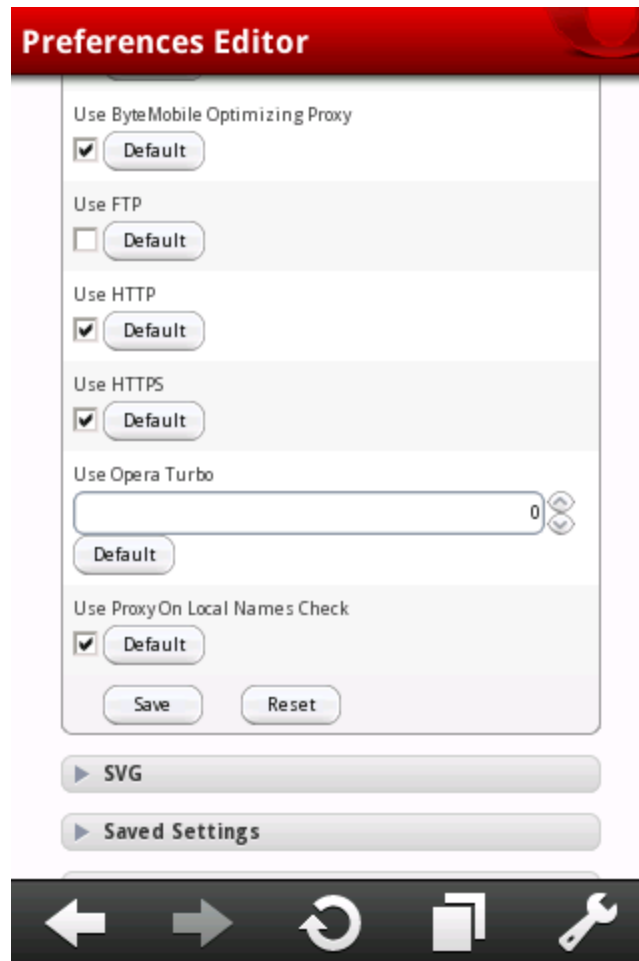
3. Now Scroll down again until you get to **HTTP server** and **HTTPS server** and in these two fields type your proxy information in the format **192.168.0.1:3128**
